

Lee County lifts restrictions on H1N1 vaccines

The health department on Monday announced it will offer the immunizations to healthy individuals of any age.

The vaccinations will be given at Lehigh Senior High School from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m.

The health department will still offer H1N1 vaccinations at three other clinics to those in the priority groups and boosters for children 9 years old and younger.

The department says the booster H1N1 vaccination should be given about 28 days after the first dose.

According to the health department, there's no need to come early as wait times are shorter for those who come a bit later.

The department says no medical or residency documentation is required.
